Museum Opens for 2018! Sunday, April 8th, 1 to 4 pm



2018—Our 50 year Anniversary!

Bothell Historical Society's first meeting was held at the home of Carlton Ericksen on January 15, 1968. The purpose of this society was "collecting and preserving the history of the Bothell trading area." Gladys Worley, who grew up in the Hannan House, was the first president of the newly formed Society. The planning committee included the following members: Carlton Ericksen, Amy Stickney, Marguerite Chase, Charles Green, Art Pearson, and Gladys Worley—a veritable Who's Who of early Bothell. The Historical Society' long term goal was the establishment of a permanent museum but in the meantime, it was suggested artifacts could be displayed in store windows.

Later in 1968, Northshore Bank offered the Hannan House on Main Street to the newly formed organization. The bank wanted the property for a parking lot but was willing to lease it to the Historical Society at no charge and pay for the upkeep. Many volunteers worked to get the house ready for its grand opening on July 4, 1969. Around the same time, the Beckstrom log cabin became available and was moved behind the Hannan House. For several years the museum operated on Main Street with these two buildings.

In 1978 the Park at Bothell Landing was created and the Lytle House was moved into the park. Soon after, the Hannan House and Beckstrom Cabin were moved to their permanent locations. In the late 1980s, Bothell's first schoolhouse which was across the street from the Hannan House on Main street, became available and was moved to the park.

Throughout this year and next, we will be celebrating the milestones of the Bothell Historical Museum Society as we move toward our next 50 years.

POP KEENEY STADIUM UPDATE

What happened to the request to rename Pop Keeney Stadium?

In the spring of 2016 the Northshore School District was petitioned by approximately 100 residents to rename Pop Keeney Stadium. In June 2016 an Exploratory Name Change Committee (ENCC) was formed by the NSD consisting of twenty Northshore residents and staffed by a District Administrator.

The committee developed the following goals and guidelines to be used in the remaining process:

Preserve the historical significance of Pop Keeney Stadium; (2) Honor Pop Keeney (3) Honor the NSD students who gave their lives in wars or military conflicts (4) Have a place of honor for fallen NSD students on school district property (5) Be clear who is being honored (5) Find a school district location that acts as a gathering place for a Veterans Memorial.

In the fall of 2017 it was unanimously agreed that no name change was needed to Pop Keeney Stadium and a new committee will develop a proposal for a Veterans' Memorial outside the Stadium such as placing a bench and signage outside the Stadium in honor of Veterans.

The Keeney Family greatly appreciates the Museum's support in educating the community about the historical significance of Pop Keeney to our community. Pat Pierce wrote a letter on behalf of the membership. Sue Kienast, as a member of the committee, was a great support to the family members as she was able to speak from a historical perspective separate from the family. We also thank all others who wrote letters to the NSD and the community. We also appreciate the work of District staff who provided the structure to make the process and outcome positive for all.

A Story About the Beckstrom Family

Robert Beckstrom and other Beckstrom descendants were given "Nana's Book" complied by his second cousin, Mary Baldwin. Nana is Selma Beckstrom, daughter of Andrew and Augusta Beckstrom, original Bothell pioneers, and Mary's great grandmother. Selma wrote stories about her life traveling to the West and living in the wilderness. Her stories were fiction, but based on real happenings in her family's life. Mary found Selma's stories and assembled them into a beautiful book creating a detailed, well-researched history of the Beckstrom family.
